# NOTE FROM BRIAN DIXON

## Senior Vice President for Governmental and Political Affairs

Here's our *Congressional Report Card* for 2021-2022. These have been an eventful two years.

What this report card highlights is the need to elect more progressive leaders to Congress so that we can pass increased funding for international family planning programs; permanently end the Global Gag Rule; repeal the Helms and Hyde Amendments that deny safe abortion access to people across the United States and around the world; and pass new federal laws to guarantee access to abortion for every American.



When the Supreme Court eliminated Americans' constitutional right to abortion, it made this November's election even more important. You'll find profiles of a small number of the candidates who we've endorsed in 2022 at the end of this report card. You can see the full list of endorsements—which are ongoing—at [popconnectaction.org/vote/endorsements](https://popconnectaction.org/vote/endorsements).

Report cards are important snapshots. They can tell you a lot, but they can't tell you everything. It's notable that no Republican in either the House or the Senate received a grade above an F. But there are two in the Senate—Lisa Murkowski from Alaska and Susan Collins from Maine—for whom more needs to be said: Both Sen. Murkowski and Sen. Collins are crucial allies on the Senate Appropriations Committee where they help promote solid funding for family planning and legislation to permanently end the Global Gag Rule. Unfortunately, those issues have not come before the Senate for votes, so are absent from the report card. These two senators' grades would certainly be better with a wider selection of votes to score.

We hope you'll take this report card into account as you're making decisions about the candidates running in your state and congressional district and that you'll support those whom we've endorsed. We believe that by electing more champions of the issues we all care about, we'll make the world a better place for everyone by advancing programs that uphold reproductive rights and that can move us toward population stabilization.

### Lankford Amendment to Senate Budget Resolution (S.Con.Res14)

August 10, 2021

This amendment, proposed by Sen. James Lankford (R-OK), would expand abortion restrictions to a host of new federal spending and would bar federal funding to states that prohibit health care entities from refusing to provide care to certain people.

**OUR POSITION: OPPOSE**

**RESULT: PASSED, 50-49**

### Kennedy Amendment to Senate Budget Resolution (S.Con.Res14)

August 11, 2021

The amendment, proposed by Sen. John Kennedy (R-LA), sought to create penalties for health care providers offering abortion care after 20 weeks.

**OUR POSITION: OPPOSE**

**RESULT: FAILED, 48-51**

### Women's Health Protection Act (H.R.3755)

February 28, 2022

This bill would create a federal statutory right to abortion throughout the United States and would prevent state governments from imposing onerous and unnecessary restrictions or otherwise impeding access to that care. The bill required 60 votes for approval.

**OUR POSITION: SUPPORT**

**RESULT: FAILED, 46-48**

### Confirmation of Ketanji Brown Jackson as Associate Justice of Supreme Court of the United States

April 7, 2022

President Biden nominated then-Judge Jackson after Justice Stephen Breyer announced his retirement. Justice Jackson has a long record of upholding constitutional protections and a sterling reputation for fairness and integrity. She is the first Black woman to serve on the Supreme Court.

**OUR POSITION: SUPPORT**

**RESULT: CONFIRMED, 53-47**

### Overtaking Biden Administration Title X Rule (S.J.Res41)

April 27, 2022

In late 2021, the Biden administration finalized new regulations ending the Title X Domestic Gag Rule that cut the capacity of the nation's publicly funded clinics to provide services in half. On March 16, 2022, Sen. Marco Rubio (R-FL) introduced a resolution of disapproval of the new regulations. Such a resolution would have immediately reversed the Biden administration action and reimposed the Trump era gag rule.

**OUR POSITION: OPPOSE**

**RESULT: FAILED, 49-49**

### Women's Health Protection Act (S.4132)

May 11, 2022

Following the Supreme Court decision in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, eliminating Americans' constitutional right to abortion, the Senate considered an updated version of the bill that failed in February. This bill, like the earlier version, would create a federal statutory right to abortion and prevent states from imposing limitations or restrictions on access to services.

**OUR POSITION: SUPPORT**

**RESULT: FAILED, 49-51**

**DC Admission Act (H.R.51)***April 22, 2021*

This bill will admit the District of Columbia as the 51st state. For too long, residents of DC have had their reproductive freedoms subject to the whims of representatives and senators elected by others. Congress has prevented the DC government from spending its own revenues to cover residents' safe abortion care. Statehood will prevent congressional meddling in the reproductive lives of people who live in DC.

**OUR POSITION: SUPPORT****RESULT: PASSED, 216-208****Equal Access to Contraception for Veterans Act (H.R.239)***June 24, 2021*

This bill prevents the Veterans Administration from charging a fee for any contraceptive that is required by the Affordable Care Act to be covered by health insurance plans without cost-sharing.

**OUR POSITION: SUPPORT****RESULT: PASSED, 245-181****En Bloc Amendment #3, Fiscal Year 2022 State Department and Foreign Operations Appropriations Act (H.R.4373)***July 28, 2021*

This en bloc\* amendment included individual amendments to eliminate all funding (\$760 million) for bilateral international family planning programs, delete all funding to the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), prohibit U.S. membership in the World Health Organization, and prohibit any support to the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change, or the Green Climate Fund.

**OUR POSITION: OPPOSE****RESULT: FAILED, 202-217****Fiscal Year 2022 Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education Appropriation Act (H.R.4502), Motion to Recommit***July 29, 2021*

This bill made several crucial improvements to family planning and reproductive health programs across the United States. It eliminated funding for wasteful and harmful abstinence-only education programs, increased funding for the Teen Pregnancy Prevention Initiative, provided \$400 million for the Title X domestic family planning program—an increase of more than \$100 million, and deleted the Hyde Amendment. The Motion to Recommit would have killed the bill by sending it back to committee.

**OUR POSITION: OPPOSE****RESULT: FAILED, 208-217****Fiscal Year 2022 Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education Appropriations Act (H.R.4502)***July 29, 2021*

After defeating the Motion to Recommit, the House voted to pass the bill.

**OUR POSITION: SUPPORT****RESULT: PASSED, 219-208****Women's Health Protection Act (H.R.3755)***September 24, 2021*

This bill creates a federal statutory right to abortion throughout the United States and prevents state governments from imposing onerous and unnecessary restrictions or otherwise impeding access to that care.

**OUR POSITION: SUPPORT****RESULT: PASSED, 218-211**

### Women's Health Protection Act (H.R.8296), Motion to Recommit

July 15, 2022

Following the Supreme Court decision in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, eliminating Americans' constitutional right to abortion, the House considered an updated version of the bill that representatives passed in September 2021. This bill, like the earlier version, creates a federal statutory right to abortion and prevents states from imposing limitations or restrictions on access to services. The Motion to Recommit would have killed the bill by sending it back to committee.

**OUR POSITION: OPPOSE**

**RESULT: FAILED, 209-218**

### Women's Health Protection Act (H.R.8296)

July 15, 2022

Following defeat of the Motion to Recommit the bill to committee, the House passed the bill.

**OUR POSITION: SUPPORT**

**RESULT: PASSED, 219-210**

### Ensuring Women's Right to Reproductive Freedom Act (H.R.8297), Motion to Recommit

July 15, 2022

This bill will create federal law guaranteeing the right to travel freely between states to receive reproductive health care, including legal abortion. Such legislation is necessary after numerous state legislatures began looking to impose restrictions on travel out of their states for such purposes. The Motion to Recommit would have killed the bill by sending it back to committee.

**OUR POSITION: OPPOSE**

**RESULT: FAILED, 209-219**

### Ensuring Women's Right to Reproductive Freedom Act (H.R.8297)

July 15, 2022

Following the defeat of the Motion to Recommit, the House passed the bill.

**OUR POSITION: SUPPORT**

**RESULT: PASSED, 223-205**

### Right to Contraception Act (H.R.8373)

July 21, 2022

This bill creates a federal statutory right for individuals to obtain and use contraceptives and a corresponding right for providers to dispense contraceptives and information about contraception. It also prevents states from imposing limits or restrictions on access to any or all approved methods of contraception.

**OUR POSITION: SUPPORT**

**RESULT: PASSED, 228-195**
